

Earning Credit Points for Doctoral Studies in the Graduate School of Theology

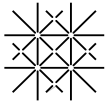
Admission requirements

Membership in the Graduate School of Theology follows admission as a doctoral student at the Faculty of Theology of the University of Basel.

Structure of the program

The structure of the program is quite open due to the disciplinary plurality within the Faculty of Theology and the varying requirements within the disciplines themselves. Any listed activity may be attended at the faculties in Bern and Zurich as well (inner-Swiss cooperation in the joint doctoral program of Theology). In total, doctoral students need to obtain 18 ECTS credit points (CP) during their doctoral studies. The amount of 18 credit points should be distributed equally among the categories listed below.

**Record of credit points**

Doctoral students must enroll online for any activity that is offered via the university course catalogue. In this case, credit points will be recorded as announced in the course catalogue. Credit points earned outside of the course offerings need to be agreed upon in advance with the supervisor and listed in a learning contract (online tool in services.unibas) approved by the supervisor.

**Doctoral examination**

The doctoral examination follows the doctoral studies regulations.

**Responsibility**

The commission for examination and teaching of the Faculty of Theology of the University of Basel (“Prüfungs- und Unterrichtskommission”) is responsible for doctoral studies.
